The Closet will close beginning March 8 for several construction and renewal projects. A new breakroom is being built for staff and volunteers, with improved seating during breaks and lunches. The area where the current breakroom resides will be opened up, to become part of the clothing and linens processing area. New flooring will be installed in the book/media room and the voucher room, and these same areas will be repainted. The store will reopen during the week of March 13, but the day for reopening is still being finalized. Volunteers are needed on Wednesday, March 8 to assist with removing shelves and merchandise from the areas being renovated, as well as around March 14 with moving shelving and merchandise back into the renovated areas. This work will involve some potentially lifting so requires able-bodies volunteers.

Welcome to Lent, friends!

This season in the life of the church has a rich history. I love the way this is expressed in our "Invitation to Lenten Discipline" found in the liturgy for Ash Wednesday. Here's what that says:

"Early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to participation in the life of the Church.

In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith."

That last paragraph resonates with me. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is one that points in the direction of mercy and forgiveness. All of us stand in need of renewal of faith. That's why I'm excited for our Lent series called Let My People Go. We're re-tracing the Exodus narrative, bearing witness to the people of Israel and how their story is intertwined in the roots of our stories today.

As I've been preparing to preach in this series, I've been reflecting on what it means to live in discipline, especially in the season of Lent. While I have many principles that center my living, I don't find myself to be particularly disciplined (just ask my dietician, dissertation chair, and...anyone else). It is easy for me to take on practices and then give them up after a short time. Maybe you can resonate with this.

This Lent, one of the things I'm hearing God say is to focus less on your practice and more on the fruit of your practice. Coaching Upward this year has helped me to learn this. I came in wanting to run particular drills to teach particular skills to my fifth and sixth graders. It turns out that they best learn by scrimmaging – figuring things out on the fly. If we stuck to my boring drills, we might not have grown much as a team over the season. But by adjusting my perspective so that we could get the most out of our young players, our whole team has grown by leaps and bounds.

It is a true blessing to journey with you as a part of the Herndon UMC family. I hope and pray that you find yourself practicing discipline in some capacity this Lenten season. However you do that, my biggest prayer for you is that you might focus on the fruit, not, just the way you cultivate it.

Lent and Holy Week

Let My People Go | Lent in Exodus Sermon Series, February 22 - April 9

In the season of Lent, we typically reflect on our sinful nature as we anticipate the death and resurrection of Jesus. But what if this isn't the way God wants us to think about Lent? What if Jesus' life, death, and resurrection were less about atonement of sin and more about freedom to live? This Lenten season, we'll look at the story of Exodus, the first great story of freedom, so that we might better understand the freedom God gives all through Jesus. As we go on this journey, we will have a better understanding of the suffering of God, God's people, and the triumph of freedom God has given to God's people.

Lent Worship | KIDS and Nursery Changes

The Exodus story contains content vital to our story as resurrection people AND it is important to engage us all with age-appropriate material. So, during Lent, there will not be a Children's Message during worship. Instead, there will be intentionally intergenerational and age-appropriate elements included within the first 10 minutes of worship. Children (3 years to grade 6) are invited to transition into KIDS CLUB with the Passing of the Peace, and will return around the Invitation to Giving. During the in-between, kids will have time in KIDS CLUB to engage in Lenten practice and music, led by Mallory Hopper and Margaret Tobat.

The Nursery check-in system is being updated to a digital check-in sheet, where adults simply click a checkbox to note their child's attendance as they are dropped off. The Nursery staff are ready to assist as needed.



Picturing God | A Lenten Devotional



What image comes to mind when you think of God? How can art and beauty draw us closer to Jesus? This year's Lenten devotional is called "Picturing God."

A group of pastors, scholars, and folks who love Jesus have worked together to create a devotional that is inspired by the power of art, specifically religious art, to point us to God. Each entry focuses on one piece of artwork, connects it with Scripture or the life of faith, and offers a reflection on how this image can deepen our experience of Lent and/or our spirituality. The people writing these devotions are not art historians or professional art analysts. They are followers of Jesus who are seeking to explore art as an aid to our prayer, aids to the study of Scripture, and a location where the Holy Spirit might meet us and turn our hearts to God.

The devotional entries spread throughout the season of Lent, but not daily. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, there are entries for Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, of each week. Beginning on the Wednesday before Holy Week, there are daily entries, which run through Easter. You can find the devotional at <a href="https://example.com/hermal/herm

We have yet another failed HVAC unit, serving the music room. The Trustees have started getting estimates to replace the unit.

The numbers in the table are indicators of the financial health of Herndon UMC-how we are doing with income and expenses, and how spending is impacting our total assets. We continue to run at a deficit. RMT continues to work towards a balanced budget for the 2023-24 fiscal year, while better aligning all of our resources with our mission and vision.

There is no update on the Employee Retention Credit at this time. When received, these funds will help us recover from losses sustained over the last 20 months and provide funds to enrich missions and ministries aligned with our vision moving forward.
