

# **Growing Closer to Jesus**

Lent and Holy Week offered many opportunities to grow in our faith and in our relationships with Jesus. The theme for the Lenten sermon series was "Growing Closer to Jesus," and the focus was on Spiritual Disciplines—practices that help us grow closer to Jesus like prayer, fasting, almsgiving, silence, and solitude. Response stations were set up in the Welcome Center to help people reflect and share about these disciplines. There were also studies, special worship opportunities, and a Lenten devotion to help participants grow their personal relationship with Christ. Special opportunities included:

## Palm Sunday | A Tale of Two Processions

There was not a processional planned for the 8 am Palm Sunday service. There were palms that would be waived, but the attendance is usually small. Early that morning a special request came in, a family that would not be able to attend at 10am, the kids wanted to process with the palms, and just like that a procession filled with joy was created. Hosanna in the highest!




Despite the cool temperatures, at 10 am we tried something a little different, processing in from outside waving palms and joyfully singing

> Ho-ho-ho-hosanna Who-who-who is coming? He he he is Jesus! And I've got the joy of the Lord!!!

## Way of the Cross | All Our Senses



Bitter dark chocolate and Judas' betrayal; the smell of baby powder and the swaddle of prayer shawls while Jesus spoke to his mother, Mary; the touch of a red ink print to the palm as a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice; and the sound of many languages woven together in heartbreaking melody— these and more reminded us of the story of Jesus' greatest gift of love for us all. On Wednesday and Thursday of Holy Week, more than 30 folks walked and prayed through 15 different sensory stations, following Jesus' final steps to the Cross. Each

station included scripture, an activity focused on one of the five senses (sight, sound, touch, smell, or taste). Thanks be ever always to God.

Kids gathered for games and crafts, followed by an Egg Hunt unlike any other. Kids were divided into grade-level teams; and worked together to find as many of their designated color eggs as possible.
